

A nice porch or veranda can offer the best seat in the house

Country, town or city, all the world's a stage when viewed from a breezy, outdoor perch



Built in 1895, this Queen Anne Revival mansion has a large circular front veranda from which to view the historic neighbourhood and a solarium that runs across the back of the house with views of the garden.

Pros There are four storeys and 20 rooms, including nine bedrooms, seven bathrooms and nine fireplaces. Each room in the house is decorated in a different kind of wood. One bedroom is fully panelled in bird's-eye maple, another in cherrywood. The most impressive is the Willson Suite with its high ceilings, balcony, fireplace, huge ensuite bathroom and ensuite sitting room. The fourth floor has three rooms, one with an elevated stage. In the basement (the former servants' quarters) there is a butler's pantry, a servants' lounge and a fruit cellar.

Con A mansion of this size demands a much larger acreage than the standard lot that it's on.
